





Catching Up with Robert Trent Jones, Jr.

When last we saw Bobby Jones, Jr. he was basking in the afterglow of a successful and memorable U.S. Open at Chambers Bay, reaping in accolades for a high-energy renovation of Monterey Peninsula's Poppy Hills, and finishing up his first course in Ireland, Hog's Head, high on the cliff-tops overlooking gorgeous Skellig Bay

Cut to just under a year later, and Hog's Head won Golf Magazine's Best New International Course Award in a landslide, Jones is still criss-crossing the globe as spryly as he did when he was half his age, and golfers everywhere alternate marveling at his brilliance and his resiliency. Soon to be an octogenarian, Bobby doesn't get older, but he certainly gets better, and Bobby's company, RTJ2 is at the vanguard of the craft, blending artistry and strategy in his designs while using stateof-the-art maintenance techniques that save money and are environmentally friendly. Bobby's designs still beguile golfers around the globe. From Italy to Ireland or from Baja to Beijing Bobby's courses are both playable for everyone and irrepressibly fun. They are a reflection of his personality - a bon vivant. And he's done it on every continent on Earth except Antarctica.

RTJ: Don't tempt me, Jay because I'll go download a topo

map of the ice floes and radio McMurdo Station for a ride down there.

JF: Do it! I'll go with you. You know I love to ski.

RTJ: Okay well we'll have to use orange golf balls though, and we probably won't get much roll unless it's icy. Also, we'll have to dress up in shirts and ties, because the penguins will be well dressed.

(Laughter)

RTJ: Actually I'm opening a course perhaps as close to Antarctica as I've ever been. My latest design is in Argentina. It's called Termas de Rio Hondo: Thermal Springs of Deep River in Spanish. It's in Santiago de Tero, about an hour north of Buenos Aires by jet.

JF: What's the terrain like?

RTJ: While Buenos Aires and its surrounding area are generally flat, Termas de Rio Hondo

is a high desert climate. It's much like Madrid and Catalonia: dry and arid. But this site also features many hot springs. It's a magnificent site that Mauricio Macri, the President of Argentina, and Gerardo Zamora the regional governor of Santiago de Estero province are developing into a destination spot with hunting and fishing and other outdoor activities.

JF: That's got to be a first for you, designing in and around hot springs?

RTJ: No I did some work in Japan early in my career. I think it was in Karuizawa Golf 72, because it was 1972. It's two hours into the mountains from Tokyo. But it is unusual. The water from the hot springs is, of course, too hot to irrigate the golf course, but the Deep River is right there, so we use that cool water for irrigation.

JF: Tell us about some of the more interesting holes and architectural features.

RTJ: A number of holes have many different ways to play them, and so the par can be adjusted to whatever set of tees they set or whichever green they put the pn in since we have one hole with a two greens that alternate. On the sixth hole, it is either a two shot or three shot par-5 depending on where they place the tee markers. There is a central stand of trees and you must choose which fairway to take around them - the high road or the low road. With the tee markers back, it's a true three-shotter, but with the tees forward it's reachable in two.

Then at nine we build on that idea by having two greens one of which makes the hole a par-4 and the other a par-5, The green complexes are markedly different; the par-4 green is a true punchbowl, while the par-5 features a strategic shot to a green placed right up against a barranca. They choose what green is in play by putting the flag in it, and that determines whether its a par-4 or a par-5.

Finally, on the back nine, the 15th hole can play either as a long par-3 or as a drivable par-4, depending on the tee placement.

JF: So it's a remarkably flexible golf course.

RTJ: It is indeed.

JF: Have you been employing any of those ideas at any of he other new courses you're working on?

RTJ: Well you know me, I like to be whimsical. I like to be avante garde. For example, right now, you're reaching me in Baja, Mexico at Costa Palmas. I'm doing 18 new holes, nine by the sea and nine inland. Again a beautiful dry arid site, but also oceanside.

JF: Baja and Cabo in particular are unusual like that. They have desert aridness right on the edge of the ocean.

Sprayed the greens late last week with a fungicide which delays fall/winter dormancy and should assist in spring green up. Yes think spring!

Bunker Repair and End of Season Greens Spray



Our bunkers have gone through their 6th season and are in need of some repair. Most of the entrances and exits have some wear and tear issues from both equipment and efforts to keep them clear of debris. We spent most of the day on Friday reparing the left front bunker of #5.

The first thing we had to do was remove the sod along the edge to locate the actual edges of the bun-

ker. We had to remove the excess sand that has been either blown out or drug out by our bunker rake.

We took the sod off and scraped the sand down to the soil layer and dug down along the sand until we found the original bunker edge that was done in 2012.

Once this was completed, we then laid new fescue sod and then

moved the sand up against the new sod to assist in stabilizing the bunker edge over the next few months. In some cases, we will need to remove sod from the green splash side of a bunker as well. We will attempt to complete a bunker a week until sod cannot be cut from our supplier and will then begin again in late winter/spring hopefully completing most of the problem areas before spring has fully arrived. We will of course be checking sand depths and adding sand as needed as well to insure we have proper depths for our members and guests to play.

Some of you might have noticed the greens were pretty bright in color over the weekend. No, not a lot of growth taking place. We sprayed a fungicide called Civitas which has some late season benefits as well as early season benefits for 2019. Click on the link if you want to read more about it.





RTJ: They do. Right now we are on the eastern capearea, about an hour and a half northeast of Cabo San Lucas. It's a little remote, but there's a marina with great sport fishing.

JF: What's the golf course like? When will it open?

RTJ: The nine holes on the oceanside are already planted, and the entire course will be in play next year by June 1. The course plays along the dunes. It's a spectacular setting.

JF: Are there any ideas here that are similar to to the flex ideas of Argentina

RTJ: It's funny you should ask that because we are debating whether number seven is a par-4 or a par-5. We decided to make it a par-5 crossing an arroyo, very similar to crossing Hell's Half Acre at number seven at Pine Valley or the wasteland at number 17 at Baltusrol. Those are direct influences there. But also like those holes, you can hit out of the hazard, and we wanted to make it playable out of our arroyo too.

And then we just finished a remodel of nine holes at Oxbow, in Fargo, North Dakota.

JF: An oxbow is a bend in a river, isn't it?

RTJ: Right first time! In this case the Red River, a tributary into the Missouri.

Oxbow was an exciting course I designed originally in the 1970s. But the Red River floods and the club decided it might be prudent to move the nine holes in the flood zone. So they asked the Army Corps

of Engineers to make a recommendation, and the Army Corps suggested that the holes in the oxbow be moved into the prairie lands right above the oxbow. So I got to build nine entirely new holes, and they put a new clubhouse up there

JF: What's next for you?

RTJ: Next time we can talk about my new course in Perugia, Italy. Home to St. Francis of Assisi and some of the world's best chocolates! ■

Superintendent Profile: Josh Clevenger, Claremont Country Club



How did you get your start in the golf industry?

I started playing golf as a teenager and fell in love with the game as a young adult. After high school I worked a few years for my dad in the family business, a Tire and Automotive shop in North Lake Tahoe, CA. When realized the time business and the standard school of the standard school. ized the tire business wasn't for me. I wasn't sure what to do. It took me a few years and I found myself working on a maintenance crew in Reno, NV.

Can you tell us a few things about your early life, where were you born, what high school, first jobs?



Domestic or Import?

know what you're thinking, import or domestic, what is he talking about? Is it going to be an article about cars, beer or something else? Your right it is going to be about something else. We work with these every day in our shops and they are a little more exciting than plain old import or domestic cars and beer.

I am just going to dive into the nuts and bolts of this month's topic. This month I am talking about treaded fasteners, primarily nut and bolts. You ask, what does title, "Import and Domestic," have to do with nuts and bolts. Well it has a lot to do with nut and bolts. The nuts and bolts used to assemble turf equipment in general, will be either SAE (domestic) thread or Metric (import) thread and definitely not the same threads used to repair our clothes.

If you are like me, I always have an interest in the history of anything mechanical and how it originated and developed into what we see and use today. The origin of the modern nuts and bolts can be found dating back to the seventh century BCE. The Assyrian King Sennacherib used wooden screws as a part of the water pumping system to provide water to the gardens of Babylon. By the first century BCE, wooden screws were commonly used in oil and wine presses. These screws had a permanent handle attached as part of the mechanism. The wooden screw and handles were turned together to crush the olives and grapes for the production of olive oil and wine.

Moving forward into the 1400s, metal screws and bolts began to be used in Europe. During the 18th century both British and the US used patented screw thread cutting lathes. These lathes produced custom screws with square heads in limited quantity. There was no standard sizing at this time. The Square heads on the screws and bolts were easy to make and the wrenches to turn them did not need to be exacting in size. Square head bolts were rather cumbersome and required more room for them to turn. Some standardization began in the mid 1800s; at the same time hex head bolts were developed to allow bolts to be more compact. During the same era, steel was starting to be produced with an accurate thickness. This allowed for mass production of nuts that lead into the development of the humble hex-head bolts and nuts we know today.

In 1864 the standard USS thread was developed by Willian Sellers. The details for this standard were written by Sellers in a paper titled, "A System of Screw Thread and Nuts". The standard for metric threaded fasteners was developed in 1898 and soon was followed in 1906 by the SAE thread which is based on the USS standard, but with a finer thread pitch.

During World Wars I and II the use of different threads between the Allied Forces became a huge

obstacle in their war winning efforts. During the late 1940s, Britain, the USA and Canada agreed on a unified thread to be the standard for all of these countries. The quality of nuts and bolts continues to improve even today, as engines run hotter and produce more horsepower than ever before. These engines will demand bolts made from aluminum, magnesium, titanium

Before getting into the different sizes and threads, I want to clarify the difference between a screw and bolt. A screw cuts its own threads as it is turned into material such as wood or mild steel. Bolts are turned into preformed threads that match the bolts' threads.

With so many different bolts how do we identify them? There are three main parts that, together, reveal the size of a bolt: the overall length not including the head of the bolt, bolt diameter and thread pitch.

Bolt length can be measured with ruler, tape measure or caliper. Bolt lengths vary but are in common increments such as 1/2, ¾, 1 inch and so on. Metric lengths are measured in millimeters 10, 15, 25 and so on. One inch is almost equal to 25 millimeters.

Bolt diameter is the size of the threaded hole in which the bolt will fit. This is the measurement across the diameter of the bolt. This measurement can be found with a

caliper, bolt size gauge or even the open-end American or Metric wrench fits the diameter accordingly.

Thread pitch is the number of threads per inch or millimeter. This is most easily determined with thread pitch gauge that will measure American and metric threads. For American thread they

will be ether fine or course thread. Metric gets tricky with a multitude of thread pitch measurement from 0.5, 0.7, 0.8, 1.0, 1.25, 1.50, 1.75, 2.0 thread. Thread pitch is the number of threads per inch or millimeter in length. For example, a 5/16-18 course thread bolt has 18 threads per inch, while a 5/16-24 is fine thread bolt with 24 threads per inch. Similar sized metric bolts

are 8mm x 1.25mm course thread or 8mm x 1.0mm fine thread.

Metric thread pitch gauge is very handy when trying to determine metric thread pitch.

Another way to identify bolts are by the grade marks or numbers on the head of the bolts. SAE will have a blank bolt head for grade 2, three marks on the head for grade 5 and six marks for grade 8. Grades 5 and 8 are the most common. Metric will have a number designation on the bolt head such as 5.8, 8.8, 9.8 and 10.9, with 8.8 and 10.9 being the most common.

The grade mark is the tensile strength of a bolt. Tensile strength is the maximum amount of stress a bolt can endure from being stretched or pulled until it fails. Tensile strength determines the amount of tightening torque that can be applied to the bolt. Proper

bolt tightening torque is critical for components like a cylinder head or connecting rods and main bearing and even wheel lug nuts.

Use the included charts and picture as an aid in identifying the Domestic or Import bolts.

Making the Rounds – Part 2

This column features the author's recollections of his 31 years as a golf writer. These installments stem from his travels and experiences, which led to a gradual understanding that the game has many intriguing components, especially its people.

When you do something so long it's odd how particular memories surface while others must be deliberately retrieved. Such is the case with this article, which recalls a few characters I encountered along the way. There are many other such folks, which may come to light in future installments. But, for some reason – a human version of random-access memory? – these are a few who recently came to the fore.

Don Cutler - A Man Ahead of his Time

The first course I visited while researching my book, "Golf Courses of the Pacific Northwest," was the sublime Elkhorn Valley in Lyons, Ore. In retrospect, I couldn't have picked a better place to start. There I met Don Cutler, who, unbeknownst to him, became one of my personal heroes.

Don set the tone – with a standard of excellence and certain Northwest outside-the-box mentality – for what might await me during my upcoming years of research. So, here's Don's story.

While on a fishing trip in the early 1960s, Salem natives Don, and his wife, Bonnie, discovered the 480 acres they ended up buying – in the Opal Creek Wilderness on the west side of the Cascades. After selling their large manufacturing company, the couple sought to convert the property into a resort with an 18-hole course and assorted guest amenities. Unfortunately, that attempt devolved into a costly 10-year battle with state agencies to receive approval. Sadly, or perhaps fortuitously, after expending millions of dollars while wading through regulatory

red tape, the Cutlers got approval for nine holes. That's all.

But, boy, are those holes special. They were recognized as such in the 1980s by Sports Illustrated, which ranked Elkhorn Valley as among America's top-five nine-hole courses.

Don's first and only course design stemmed from a desire (and decidedly not the government's) to protect native plants and animals, while preserving a personal tenet of "pure golf." All told, it took him 11 years to finish this 3,169-yard gem, in 1976. But the labor of love fulfilled Cutler's goals, as golfers still enjoy hawks soaring overhead as well as elk and deer foraging in nearby woodlands. Wildflowers, rhododendrons, native grasses, maples and conifers border fairways, while creeks, ponds and a lovely waterfall are on display.

Believing golfers should be in charge of their games, Cutler installed no yardage markers when the course debuted. It wasn't until his wife heard complaints that he acquiesced by adding birdhouses as 150-yard markers. Don was also way ahead of his time in other areas. In the mid-1970s, the standards were the use of tees designated for men and women. But Cutler created an alternative, which is quite common today. Before golfers reached the first tee, they encountered a large sign informing them to use tees that fit their handicaps, not their gender.

Don was given the go-ahead for a second nine holes 20 years after the first side opened. Unfortunately, he didn't see that come to fruition as

he succumbed to cancer in 1998, a few years before the addition was completed. Probably because he didn't oversee the new holes, the second side doesn't measure up to his original work.

Don Cutler still oversees his beloved Elkhorn Valley; he's buried behind the fourth green.

Jack Beaudoin - Not a Boring Man

While on my travels around the Pacific Northwest, I met many folks, the vast majority of whom were welcoming and very few who were not. An example of the latter came at the old Top O'Scott Golf Course on Portland's east side. When I walked into the pro shop and explained why I was there, the manager angrily pointed toward the door and told me to leave.

Miffed and a bit shocked as I'd been receiving overwhelming hospitality up to that point, I exited the pro shop, disregarded this blunt rebuff, went around the building and walked, took notes and photos of the rather ragged track – which now lies underneath a typical residential and commercial development. I later learned that the impolite cur had just been released from prison and suspected I might be a parole officer checking up on him.

More common were welcoming faces like Jack Beaudoin's. Beaudoin, a former pro hockey player who switched to golf, was about 5'6" and, my guess, a pesky stickman and real pain in the ass to opponents. After leaving hockey, Jack became the designer, developer, head pro and owner of Mountain View Golf

Course in Boring, Ore. When I arrived there, he greeted me as a long-lost friend, insisting that he personally take me on a tour. He proudly stepped into the photos I took of his course, named for its vistas of mounts Adams, Rainier and St. Helens in Washington and Hood in Oregon.

Jack, who passed away in 1997 at 59 after selling the course, told me he held the course record of 60. Beaudoin enthusiastically noted that the 12th hole, a 183-yard par-3, boasted the region's highest tee at 180 feet above the green. Jack took credit for a sign beside the 12th tee that read: "This hole may be hazardous to your health."

Rocking Out at Plains GC in Montana

My MO for travel itineraries was to call ahead and "warn" courses of my impending arrival. But in the late-'80s, many courses didn't have telephone, let alone the personnel to answer them. There were several times when I showed up at a so-called Podunk course sans land lines that I heard: "What are you doing here?" Once I explained that the title of my book incorporated all golf courses, people were pleased that I had made the effort to get there.

One of these quirky and remote, off-thegrid places without a land line was Plains Golf Course, named after its eponymous hometown in western Montana.

After pulling into a rutted parking lot, I walked up to the "pro shop" – a tiny red structure a bit bigger than an outhouse. I immediately – and incongruously – heard some very loud rock 'n roll. Finding the upper half of a Dutch door open, I leaned in and was blasted by "Highway to Hell" at full volume. The golf attendant/"DJ" was an old man snoring loudly as the strains of AC/DC rocked Big Sky Country pine trees.

The rocker's hair was thick and white. He was at least 80, an ideal age for overseeing Plains sleepy operation. Not wanting to interrupt his reverie, I started walking to the first hole – a straight uphill par-4 crossed above its green by massive and buzzing Bonneville Power Administration cables. Soon, I encountered another elderly gent astride a Massey-Ferguson tractor-mower older than its operator. Both were hopelessly stuck on the grassy slope, unable to move up, down or sideways. I had found Plains' maintenance staff.

I helped my new friend jimmy the tractor free, and the driver – a retired Seattle firefighter – waved, smiled and then chugged on as I continued my appointed rounds

Bunny Mason – A Renaissance Man

Gene C. "Bunny" Mason was a Pacific Northwest golf institution; his fans are legion. Like Cutler, a Salem native,



Bunny died in 2010 at age 81. He started his long career in golf as a high-school champion, moved into the club-pro ranks where he became an accomplished player and, later on, a Vice President of the PGA of America. Among his many accomplishments, Bunny started America's first destination golf academy at Black Butte Ranch in Central Oregon, and branched off into becoming one of the region's most prolific golf course architects.

For his stellar work at the regional and national levels (he founded the national PGA's Education Program and Business Schools and was the first recipient of the Horton Smith Award in 1966), Bunny was inducted into the Pacific Northwest Section of the PGA's Hall of Fame in 1981.

He was unforgettable to many. As a friend recalled at Bunny's life celebration: "One day while I was working for Bunny at Black Butte, an extremely self-assured customer came in, threw money on the counter to pay for green fees and said, 'What's the course record?' Bunny quickly replied, 'Two hours and 25 minutes for 18 holes!' The customer, deflated, walked out shaking his head."

And this: "While answering phone calls in March for starting times in July, people would ask, 'What will the weather be like?' Bunny would reply, 'I guarantee we will have weather!' "

Bunny and I go back to my start as a golf writer. He appreciated my efforts, especially the three editions of my book. He understood what I had decided to tackle. While active in course design, he subscribed to my golf project-tracking reports, "Golf Report Northwest," "Golf Report West," and, later, www. golfconstructionnews.com when it went online and I covered golf development in all 50 U.S. states.

One day, out of the blue, I received an envelope from Bunny. It contained

a \$50 bill and a note that read: "Jeff, thanks for all your hard work." I called him up to say thanks. He answered in his stentorious voice that sounded like a foghorn on a ship navigating a fogged-in Columbia River, "Well, Jeff, you do good work."

Bunny designed over a dozen golf courses in the Pacific Northwest. A mutual friend, Dan Hixson, designer of Silvies Valley Ranch's acclaimed and reversible 18-hole course in eastern Oregon, had Mason as a mentor at Columbia Edgewater Country Club in Portland where Bunny was the director of golf and Dan the head pro. "Bunny never had formal drawings," Hixson told me in 2018 of Mason's approach to golf architecture. "He'd rough-draw 18 holes on a few pieces of paper in a couple of hours and then hand them to the builder. Baffled, I asked him, 'Bunny, don't you have a CAD system or plans that are a bit more detailed?' Bunny replied, 'Nope. I've done my job.' '

Somehow, his system worked. One of Bunny's designs was Skamania Lodge's 18-hole course overlooking the Columbia River on the Washington side. During construction, he hired a shaper who was very difficult to work with. Though talented, the shaper often failed to show up on the job, never answered the phone and acted like he was the boss. In other words, this guy was a real thorn in Bunny's side.

But Bunny got even. He later took a job redesigning a course not far from Skamania. After the owner of that project repeatedly stiffed Mason on his payments, the developer asked Bunny if he knew someone who could finish

construction. Bunny replied, "Sure, but pay me first." After he finally got paid, Mason gave him the shaper's phone number, saying, "You'll really like this quy."

In the early '90s as work was underway on Bunny's private Awbrey Glen Golf Club in Bend, Ore., Bunny took several hours leading me around the site as he eagerly explained the nuances of every hole. We made the tour in my wife's then-new, dark-green Ford Explorer. The property, like that found often in Central Oregon, was comprised of basalt – fine for golf turf but not for shiny new vehicles. After Bunny and I parted ways, I went to a local car wash and, following three thorough cleanings, managed to get most of that red grit off the rig's interior and exterior.

Despite my best efforts, there was still some of that stuff in the Explorer when we traded it in a decade later. Though not everyone mentioned above didn't leave such a tangible lasting impression like Bunny Mason, they were been forgotten.
